Little League

Baseball:

Paul A. gave the report.

- A highlight of the season was the 50-70 team winning a District Banner for the first time since 2018. The team, coached by Matt Heady, Fred Ewig and Sal Agosto, advanced to the sectionals.
- The end-of-year barbecue was a success and is planned to be a recurring event.
- LTJBSA successfully hosted the District 12 and District 10 tournaments, with special thanks to all volunteers for coordinating.
- Fall programs are focused on clinics due to a lack of volunteer coaches for a full league season. Ken Dobkin is leading four clinics, while Centercourt is running indoor sessions.
- Registration for the 2026 season for baseball, softball, and t-ball will open on October 8th. The proposal is to cap t-ball at 96 players (eight teams) with a waitlist to ensure enough coaches.
- Photo Day is scheduled for Monday, May 4th.
- The Lawrence Historical Society has invited LTJBSA to co-sponsor an 1864 baseball game on Friday, May 13th, as part of the township's 250th anniversary. This event would feature an old-time team and opportunities for youth player participation. More details next month.
- Volunteers are needed for fundraising, sponsorships, the Opening Day parade, Photo Day, and Thunder Night. A VP of Baseball is also needed. This is where we need parents to get involved, especially younger players as we don't have representation of those family's needs.
- A final total of 508 participants was recorded for the year, down slightly from the previous year.

Softball:

Jake gave the report.

- The summer softball program had a strong turnout with a wide range of ages.
- The program was successfully run by Dan and Roy, with assistance from junior coaches.
- There are no plans for the fall recreational softball season.

Travel:

- Six baseball teams and three new softball teams are participating in fall leagues and tournaments.

- The 9U team won their first USABL spring league, and the 12's won their third.

- The Snack Shack's reputation for great food and service has grown, with teams from other towns making a point to eat there.
- Lisa Cox was thanked for her work in recruiting volunteers.
- Paul V, Jake Z, Dave S, and Paul A. all pitched in and cooked to support the District Tournament as well as the Softball Tournament.

New Business

- The board voted to purchase an Owl video conferencing system.
- The board discussed changing the meeting day to accommodate more attendees.
- The board discussed asking travel coaches to participate in cleanup day.
